Whether your child is drawn to pop or classical, jazz or folk, prefers to play alone or in a group, at home or at school, we have some great opportunities for them. Most of our activities are low cost, sometimes free, and we are constantly innovating to keep young people engaged.

We also signpost you to other excellent local and national opportunities offered by our Music Education Hub partners.

There are so many benefits to learning a musical instrument or to sing, and we can help every step of the way. We offer vocal and instrumental lessons that can be taken individually or in a group, at school or at home. To help you choose an instrument you might try different ones at our taster days, or have lessons on a few instruments before you commit. With 80 Cambridgeshire Music tutors teaching nearly 30 instruments, we can help you.

We believe playing in a group with others is at the heart of developing young musicians. Not only do they experience the power of producing a big sound, but often make friends, and are stretched musically.

Start with an After-School Music Club and progress to the intermediate, then advanced, county orchestras and ensembles. Music Factories focus on jazz, folk, metal, pop, composition, performance and improvisation.

Music Theory deepens your understanding of music. It is really useful for budding composers, arrangers and songwriters, and is essential for some advanced grade exams. We focus on building up to Grade 5 in music theory.



We have a whole bank of over 30 types of instruments, from cellos to flutes and drum kits to guitars, based at our Huntingdon centre.

We also organise a wide range of projects and events helping to create unique musical experiences. You might perform in a major venue, take part in national celebrations or learn to compose or record.





### **BURSARIES**
