Easter Sound Hunt

Grab your trainers, your listening ears and let's go!

Take a walk somewhere you enjoy as a family, it could be near or far, to the local park, the countryside or just round the houses but you need to be able to find a stick (big, small; any kind will do, whichever stick you like the look of) and maybe a notepad and pencil.

As you walk try to notice the sounds you hear; can you hear the birds, the wind in the trees, a lawnmower, cars, cows in a field?

You might also use your stick or feet or hands to make new sounds against a lamppost, or the floor. Does the metal slide sound different to the rubber swing?

Are there any natural objects you can hunt out which can make sounds? Pine cones or pieces of fallen bark can make great nature instruments.

Write down the different sounds you find on your sound hunt, you could make it a competition to find the most!

When you've finished your sound hunt bring your sticks and any nature instruments you've found home. Paint and decorate your sticks and put them in an old plant pot or vase to make your own Easter tree. You could decorate your Easter tree with your nature instruments, homemade decorations or kind words to your family.
